Meet your Neighbors Tracy & Jeff Snyder!

Tracy had gone with a girlfriend and Jeff with a friend growing up. By the time the doors opened to the venue, the two entered together and have pretty much stayed that way ever since. After a great show, they went dancing, having a wonderful time, then stopping for a bite to eat and some conversation. When Tracy asked Jeff what he did for a living, he said "construction." Intuitive woman that she is, Tracy said, "No, you don't, now tell me the truth." Jeff fessed-up to being a policeman. He told her how he just wanted to have a fun time without making anyone uncomfortable about what he did for a living, although doing construction work was something Jeff has done part-time for many years, even before they met. The two worked hard in their chosen fields with their eyes on retiring early and moving where the weather and terrain suited their souls. As life tends to do, there have been twists and turns along the way. Tracy spent her professional life as an executive assistant and event planner in the corporate world. Jeff served 28 years as an officer with the Woodbury Police Department. Woodbury is a suburb of Minneapolis. Their collective mindset was on early retirement, but just how early was determined by circumstances beyond their control. In 2020, the Snyders lost two of their five adult children within ten weeks of each other. To deal with their sorrow, they sought solace in the calm of the ocean. Jeff, especially, is drawn to the ocean. Spending time here at Ocean Dunes has been a panacea for them both. Their time at the shore got them thinking about even-earlier retirement and they started their search for their perfect place. "Chapter 2" needed to include the beach, but just where was up in the air. They quickly ruled out some places: West Coast, Hawaii, Florida Panhandle. Then, ta-da—North Carolina! Having narrowed it down to NC, they started looking from Ocean Isle to Emerald Isle and many places in between. They looked at 1604 and loved it from the get-go, but felt they owed it to themselves to be really, really sure. They were! The road kept leading back to Ocean Dunes and then they KNEW, "This is home." The two-story town home set-up is perfect for them. Lots of downsizing had to take place including a remarkable piece of their lives. Whereas most folks have much downsizing to do when they move in retirement, the Snyders had a particularly unique situation. Jeff was the owner of a very significant and extensive sports card collection, an entire room's worth. He'd collected them all his life, his collection had complete sets of cards for every year starting in 1952 through 2008 in hockey, football, and baseball. Parting with such an integral part of one's life is tough, but he made the decision and sold the collection to a big-time collector/dealer. Tracy and Jeff continue with hobbies they have enjoyed most of their lives. Tracy has added "background casting," to her list, being an extra in productions in the Wilmington/Carolina Beach area. She is in search of something to take the place of white-water rafting and motorcycle riding that she loved all her life, and she is sure she will. Decorating is another hobby she enjoys, putting it to the test when they completed renovating their unit with everything being new. Jeff grew up playing hockey and has continued to play at a higher level throughout his adulthood, although he admits that age is starting to catch up with him a little bit.



Fortunately, he has found an ice rink in the Wilmington area and will be putting on his skates and uniform again. The Snyders love traveling and have done plenty of it since they moved here in November of 2020: four big cruises and trips to the Caribbean, Hawaii, and many parts in between. But that may be curtailed somewhat with what these two "doers" have going on now. Recently, Tracy was recruited to resume her role as an executive assistant and event manager with a corporation based in Germany. She will be able to do most duties from Ocean Dunes but will be traveling afar at least eight times a year. Jeff, who admits to not being able to sit still, is now a handyman on the island and in Wilmington. He has plenty to keep him busy and that's a good thing. Speaking of good things, Tracy and Jeff Snyder are two very good things. Ocean Dunes is fortunate to have them in our midst. They truly personify what is good in lives well lived.



Explore Swamp Park!





The Shallotte River Swamp Park & Outdoor Center, located near Ocean Isle Beach, is a fun daytrip for Ocean Dunes families and their guests. If you take the Southport Ferry, a fun time on its own, the Park is 30 miles; if you go through Wilmington, not a fun time on its own in this reporter's humble opinion, it's 58 miles. Whichever route you choose, the Swamp Park is worth the drive. Touted by the owner to be the "Largest and Longest Zip-line Canopy tour on the Eastern Seaboard, guided ATV tours, continuous belay ropes course, Eco-boat tours, and LIVE Alligators."



The Swamp Park folks are knowledgeable and helpful. There are three ziplines for all levels and guided ATV tours for all levels. Trails meander through the quiet splendor of an untouched swamp and who doesn't love the thrill of being close to the biggest gators this reporter has ever seen, while safely above as shown in the accompanying photos, which were taken on our visit in October.

While there, one may enjoy the self-guided, mile-long river walk trail. Mosey down the raised walkway and take in the sights and sounds of an untouched Carolina swamp land. The zipline takes you far above the park with a overview of the swamp where you might catch sight of wild boar, owls, raccoons, turkey, and deer. The ropes course offers three distinct levels of expertise appropriate to healthy individuals 4 and up.



The eco-boat ride my husband and I went on was led by a smart, exuberant guide. We slowly putted through the Shallotte River swamp with its Spanish moss, cypress knees, and other exotic flora, learning about this beautiful area as we meandered.

An extraadded perk is that the Swamp Park is less than 9 miles from Calabash, where

Also, there will not be a FC meeting at the end of December because CAMS will be finalizing the End of Year statements in late January. At that time, we will review the EOY statements as well as the January 2024 statement if that is completed before our meeting date.

The committee met on November 16th and discussed upcoming articles on things to do in the Wilmington / Pleasure Island area and our next interview subjects. We appreciate the help from the CAMS onsite managers in publishing this monthly newsletter.



As mentioned in our last months report, on Monday, October 23rd, the town of Kure Beach agreed to enter into an agreement with Ocean Dunes to be a sponsor for grants that require the town to be the applicant. This is just one type of grant and there are others where the applicant is Ocean Dunes and the funds go directly to Ocean Dunes. By having this partnership it broadens our opportunities for all types of grants.

Also referenced was that the town's lawyer and the lawyer for ODHOA would work on a memorandum of understanding (MOU) to formalize the partnership. The town and ODHOA approved the MOU on 11/20. The town and ODHOA also agreed to a LOI or Letter of Intent as a next step in the process and the town and MS Consultants / ODHOA are working on this agreement which is due by 12/1... Additional work will be done outlining in more detail the specific responsibilities depending on the type of grant to be applied for.

We intend to file for a grant with FEMA prior to the deadline of December 1, 2023.

COMMITTEE REPORTS



The Governing Docs Committee sent a revised version of the long Rules & Regs to the board for approval.

The HOA attorney has received the proposed changes and is the process of reviewing them.



The Community Manager Mike Brown arranged a meeting with our landscape contractor, Hobbs. They walked the property and identified areas needing attention, mostly shrub trimming. That work began a few weeks ago and will continue until the trimming is completed. The property is already looking much better!



LRPC will have our EOY The meeting on 12/11/23. We will update the Reserve project list for 2023 and review the list for 2024. The end of year financials for projects will be updated with actual costs, to compare against what the projected cost for each project was. We may not have the estimates for the larger projects, i.e. building paint/repair and decking, and the dehumidification pool system until January. Once we get all the data we will engage with G&F Engineers to refresh the Long Range Plan. As always, we welcome your questions and comments. You can email me msposato@twcny.rr.com. 
