

Sea Turtle Hatching Season

North Carolina is in the midst of sea turtle hatching season. We are fortunate in Fort Fisher to have a relatively quiet beach with most beach combers being respectful of nests. Nests can have anywhere from 80 to 120 eggs, and once hatched, the baby turtles must make their way to the ocean.

During their trek to the ocean, they have to worry about predators like crabs and birds, along with issues caused by humans like pollution.

"We have trouble with folks leaving big holes where the moms and the hatchlings fall into these holes that people dig and don't fill back in, or a big sandcastle where they can't go through it or a hatchling can't go through the big sandcastle. So those are like just leaving the beach, kind of how you found it, because that is their nesting ground," said Michele Lamping, N.C. Aquarium sea turtle specialist.

The eggs typically hatch at night, but there is no way to tell when. During the months of May, June, July and August, loggerhead sea turtles crawl out of the Atlantic Ocean to lay their nests on the shore. A loggerhead mother uses her rear flippers to dig a nest chamber in the sand, then deposits approximately 100 round, white leathery eggs. The mother turtle then covers the nest chamber, concealing it with sand, and crawls back to sea, never to meet her offspring. The eggs incubate for approximately 45–70 days before hatchlings emerge.







In the state of North Carolina, all sea turtle nests remain "in situ," meaning the nests are left in place and not relocated to a nursery. If a nest is laid below the high tide line, it is relocated to the nearest safe spot above the high tide line.

Because sea turtles nest at night, under the cover and protection of darkness, it is very rare to spot a sea turtle in the act of nesting. So, to find nests, volunteers look for tracks in the sand while monitoring the beach at dawn.

Loggerhead sea turtle tracks resemble ATV tire tracks, with a flat section in the center created by the sea turtle's body and flipper marks on each side. Each track is approximately 40 inches wide and there are two sets: one set from when the nesting mother crawled up toward the sand dunes and a second set from when she crawled back into the ocean. The spot in between, often marked by a gentle mound of sand, is where the nest is located.

You've heard the adage "Don't knock it 'til you've tried it"?
This holds true for okra. Step out of your comfort zone and try a new vegetable. Your taste buds will thank you. This is best served immediately. This is eaten as a snack in southern homes. Buy fresh okra, not the grocery store stuff wrapped in cellophane. Eagle Island or a farm store or farmers market.

Crispy Roasted Okra

Ingredients:

- 1 lb okra fresh and washed
- · 1 tbsp olive oil
- · 1/2 tsp salt
- · 1/4 tsp black pepper
- · 1/2 tsp garlic powder (optional)



Instructions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 425°F (220°C).
- 2. Cut off the stems of the okra and slice into rounds.
- 3. In a mixing bowl, toss the okra with olive oil, salt, pepper, and garlic powder until evenly coated.
- 4. Spread the okra in a single layer on a parchment-lined baking sheet.
- 5. Roast for 20 minutes, or until golden brown and tender.
- 6. Serve immediately and enjoy the crispy, delicious okra!

Notes

- You can adjust the seasonings to your taste. For a spicy kick, add cayenne pepper.
- Roasting time may vary depending on the size of your okra pieces.


We will ask for approval to do a core sample of the area below the courts to see it's depth, content, and ability to support the courts.

We have gathered lots of data, including numerous estimates on projects and ongoing maintenance, a completed Reserve Study from G&F Engineering, an independent budget proposal from CAMs and year-to-date spending on all Ocean Dunes expenses. As an ongoing process, the BODs along w CAMs vet our contractors, and seek out multiple quotes for most expenses throughout the year. We continue to follow the timetable below.

CAMS and the committee are busy keeping up with the summer crowds and all the guests we get during the season. Many of our activities we support increase greatly with all the people here during this time.

We are actively planning Fall projects and the budgeting and long range planning process has begun their meetings in preparation for 2026.

We also continue to work with our insurance broker and the insurance companies to continue our work to settle our claims from the TS-8 storm of September 2024.

Hobbs has been diligently working on the weeds. Unfortunately, he sprayed 100 gallons of weed killer on a day with no rain forecast and nothing on radar, but a downpour ensued shortly after application. On 8/22 Hobbs applied, at his expense, an additional round of weed killer so we will hopefully see results. I was there on a day the rain prohibited mowing; they used the time to prune shrubs in the rec center area. I have to say, since I've started working with Hobbs he has given 100% and then some in terms of what his contract specifies. If you see an issue with landscaping, please reach out to me, my information is on the portal under committees. Please do not approach the landscapers as this only interferes with his time at OD. Mike and I are the primary points of contact to ensure all the work is done and communication remains strong.

The board approved an additional expense of clearing out 100 and cutting back tall grass under a few decks (as the dunes allow). This will ensure proper placing of the rat boxes.

Maintenance has done a good job with the small palms and some other miscellaneous landscaping items.

The islands in front of the buildings are only the responsibility of Hobbs IF homeowners have not made changes to them. Original shrubs and trees will be maintained, and weeds will be sprayed, however if homeowners have made changes to the islands, it has created confusion. I did not make changes to the island by my building (all those owners have left), but I am constantly weeding it myself as there is no other option.

The board is still discussing the fencing discussed in the last newsletter.

The landscaping committee will hold a meeting in September.
